14. Plaintiff James A. Taylor is a citizen and resident of the State of North Carolina. He was the Weapons and Intelligence Non-Commissioned Officer, and team sergeant assigned to Detachment A-424 during the period between January 1966 and July 1966, and served under the command of Captain Marvin. He is the Sergeant Taylor to whom Defendant Marvin referred in his book "Expendable Elite". In the book, Sergeant Taylor is alleged to have conspired and committed various violations of his oath to his country, including several violations of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, sedition against his country, treason, failure to obey a direct order, and violating international law and the standing general orders of the Departments of Defense and Army.

15. Plaintiff William Menkins is a citizen and resident of the State of Texas. He was the Intelligence Non-Commissioned Officer, and a sergeant assigned to Detachment A-424 during the period between December 1965 and July 1966, and served under the command of Captain Marvin. He is the Sergeant Menkins to whom Defendant Marvin referred in his book "Expendable Elite". In the book, Sergeant Menkins is alleged to have conspired and committed various violations of his oath to his country, including several violations of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, sedition against his country, treason, failure to obey a direct order, and violating international law and the standing general orders of the Departments of Defense and Army.
